# Learning at Home: 10 Best Practices

- **Set meaningful and ambitious work** - Offer recorded or live direct teaching that is equivalent in length to core teaching
- **Keep it simple** - Don't overcomplicate resources with too many graphics and illustrations that don't add to content.
- **Focus on the basics** - Some topics are hard to teach remotely. Beware of offering too much new subject matter at once.
- **Feedback, assessment are key** - Try chatroom discussions, interactive tools, on screen questions to deliver immediate feedback.
- **Medium matters** - Pupils tend to spend longer accessing a remote lesson when they are using a laptop than when using a phone.
- **Live isn't always best** - Recorded lesson segments followed by interactive chats or tasks and feedback are good choices too.
- **Overcome digital access barriers** - Consider different forms of remote education like printed lessons, broadcast resources or textbooks.
- **Access "Get Help with Technology"** - Mobile networks are providing free data to at-risk families. Schools can request support.
- **Engagement matters** - There are more distractions. Working with parents can help. So can whole-school digital assemblies.
- **Stay up-to-date** - Government to provide £1Bn catch-up package to directly tackle the impact of lost teaching time.
